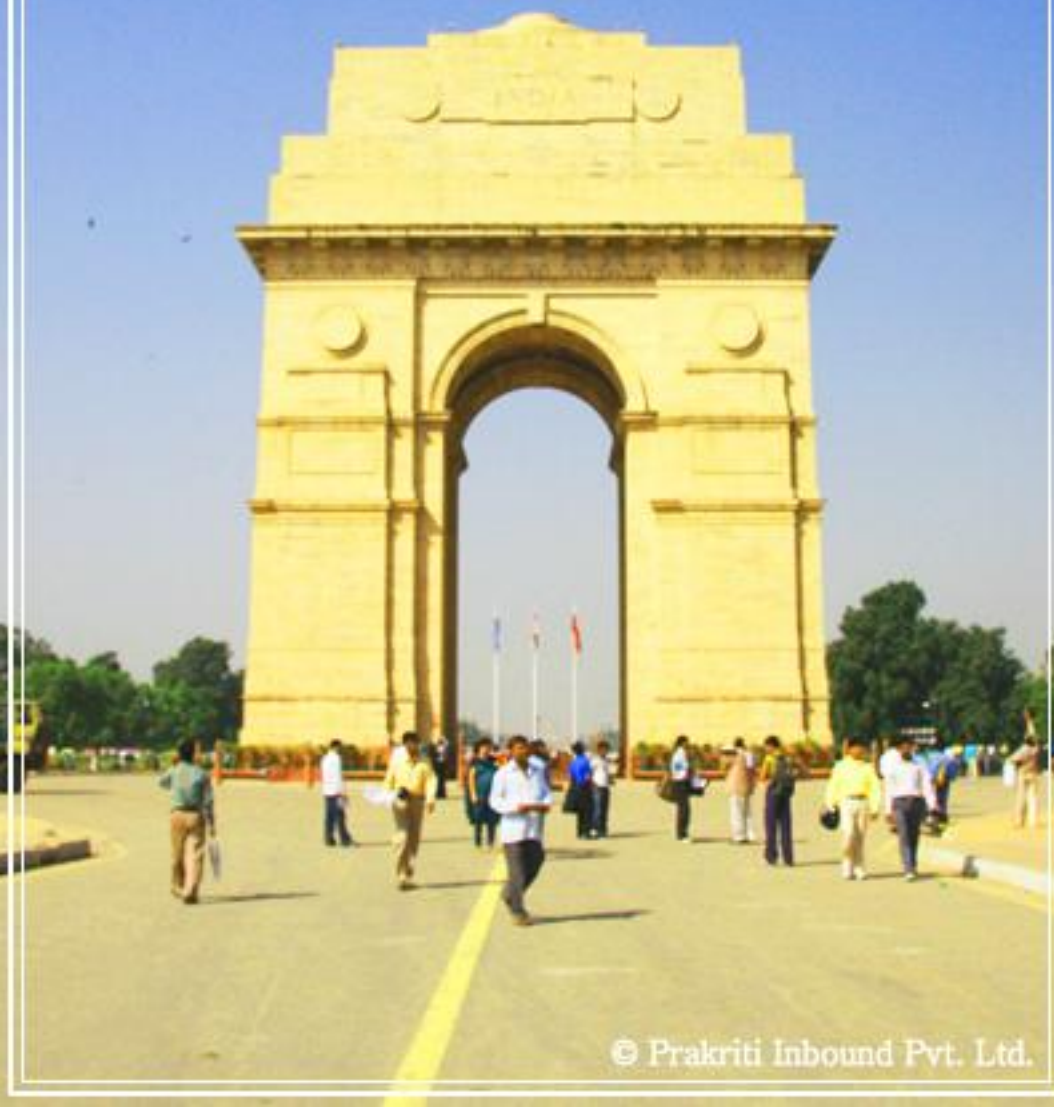
This traditional Indian gesture of greeting tells you that you are most welcome. We respect your presence in our land and shall do the best to make your visit the most memorable moments of your lives!

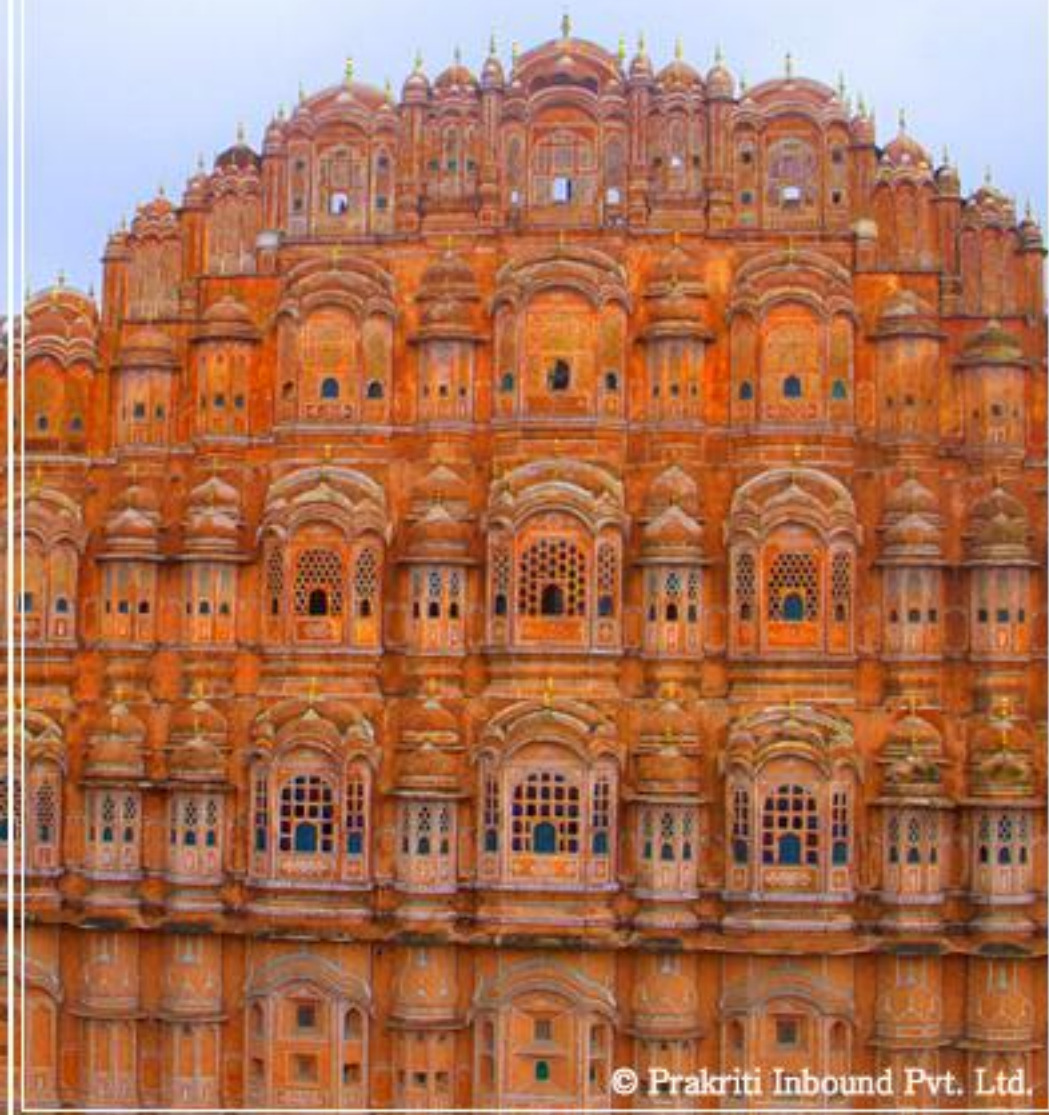
Today you shall be travelling to the most famous city of India... Agra, once a flourishing capital of the Mughal rulers, is located around 200 kms from Delhi.

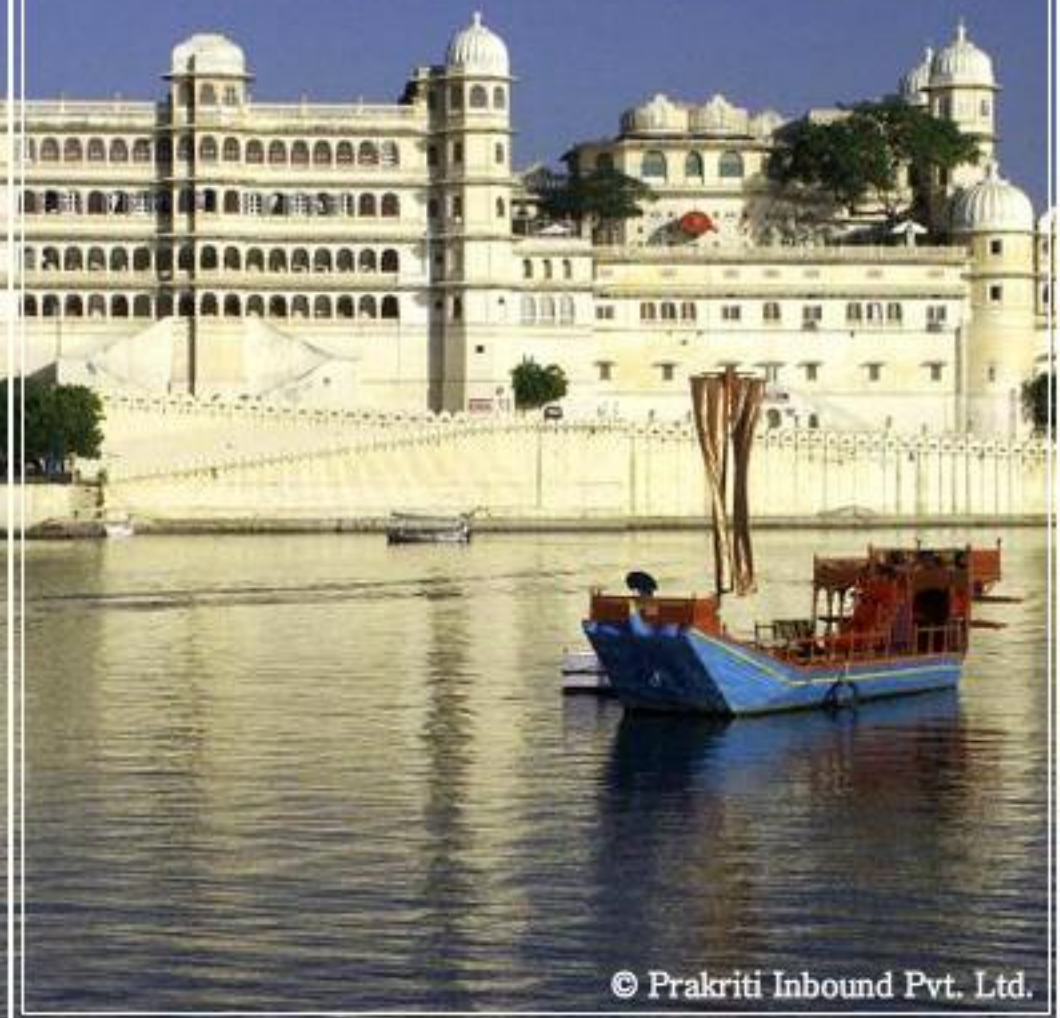

Today before taking the flight to Udaipur, enjoy the blissful ambience of the hotel. Post lunch transfer to the airport to take flight to Udaipur.

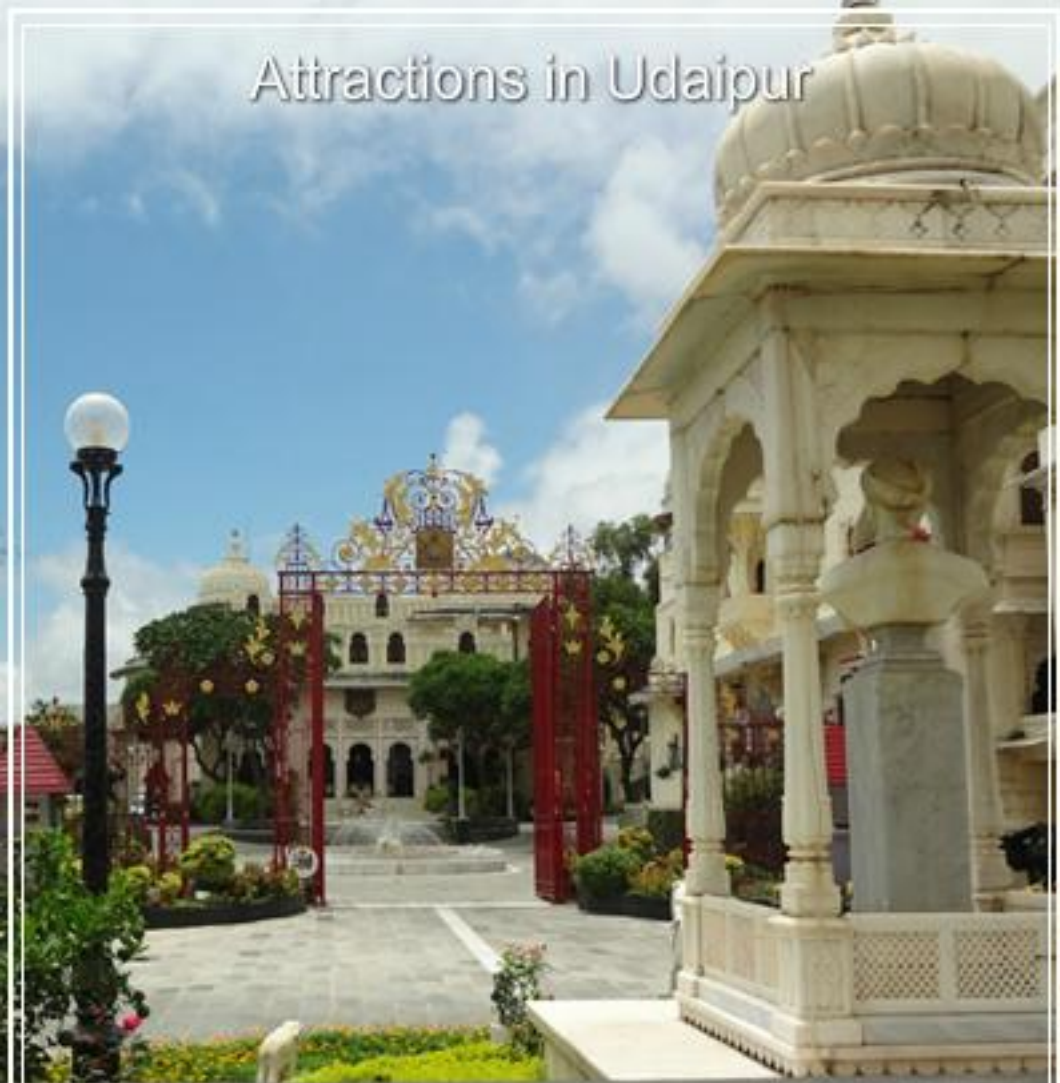

The first stop is the majestic city palace. City palace is a complete white structure, standing majestically on a hill and the largest palace complex of Rajasthan. There are series of courtyards overlapping pavilion of terraces, corridors and hanging gardens. There is the Suraj Gokhada, the balcony of the Sun, where the Suryawanshi (sons of the Sun God); Maharanas of Mewar, presented themselves in times of trouble to the people to restore their confidence. The Mor chowk or the peacock courtyard gets its name from the glass decoration it has. The chini chitrashala is noteworthy for its blue and white ceramics, while a series of wall paintings on Lord Krishna are on display

So welcome to the western and central part of India ..... I am eager to share my passion and readings of monuments and historical landmarks with you. Namasté.

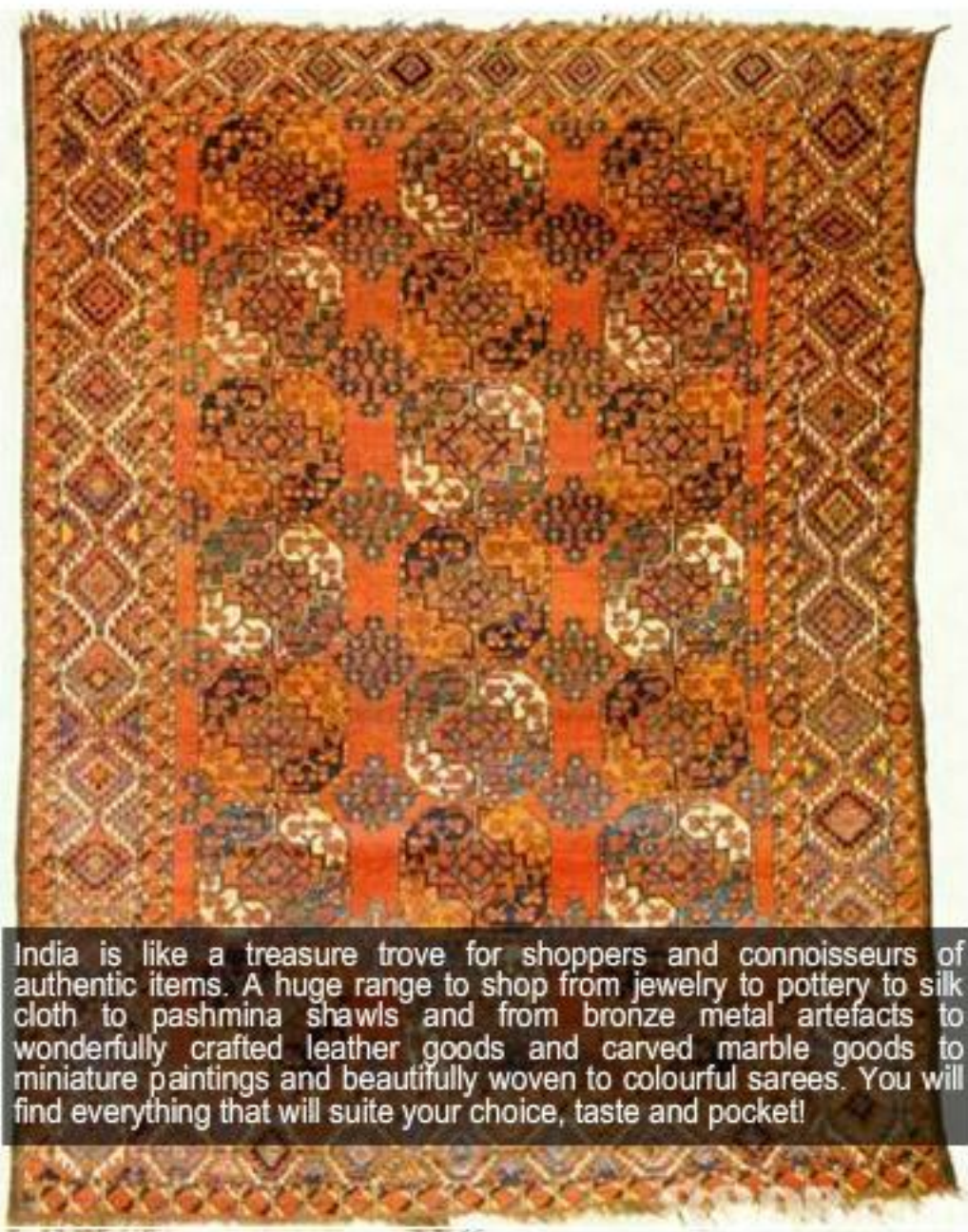
# *Dances of Rajasthan*

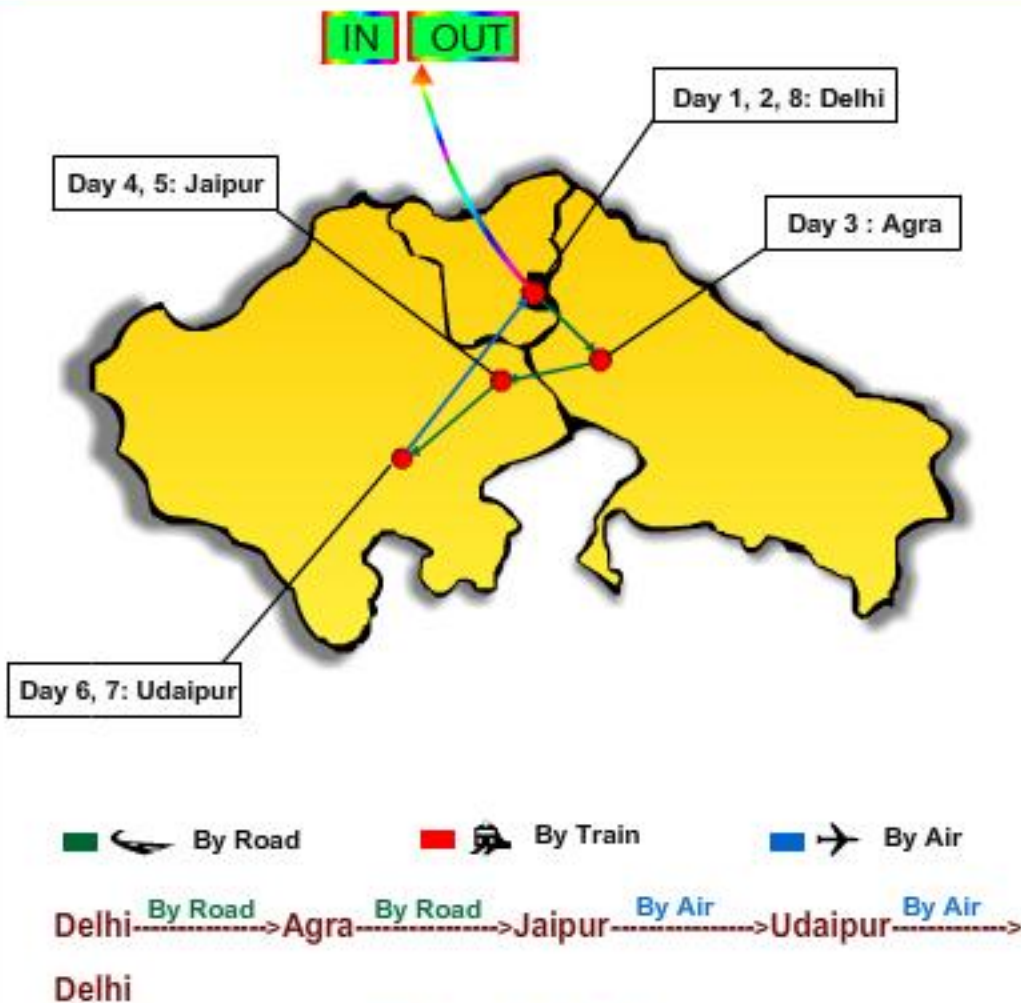
